## The Role

Northeastern University London wishes to appoint an Assistant Professor (Teaching & Scholarship) in Psychology. The appointee will provide innovative and inclusive teaching in a range of areas of psychology, as well as service to the institution and profession.

We wish to appoint someone with broad competencies in Psychology, who can contribute to teaching the first-year courses Foundations of Psychology and Developmental Psychology. Familiarity with qualitative methods may be desirable, as may the abilities to contribute to teaching in Social or Clinical Psychology, or the Psychology of Individual Differences. Preference may be given to candidates with active interests in the relationship of Psychology to one or more of the following areas: software and/or technology; employment contexts; diversity and inclusion.

Core duties will include: working collaboratively with colleagues to deliver teaching and support in Foundations of Psychology, Developmental Psychology, and/or other course offerings at NU London; and professional service commensurate with career stage.

We particularly encourage applications from those with an interest in innovative teaching, learning and assessment; those with experience of supporting a wide variety of students; and those belonging to groups underrepresented in UK higher education. We are open to appointing on a reduced fraction/job-share basis subject to our business needs.

## Department

Psychology is currently a small, but rapidly expanding discipline at Northeastern University London. With strong interdisciplinary links within the institution, including an established Cognitive Science Research Group drawing in Philosophers and Computer Scientists, the team will offer a new BA in Psychology from academic year 2023-24, in addition to its existing minor, as well as courses for visiting students on US mobility programmes, and electives for domestic students with majors in other disciplines. There is also potential for graduate level degrees in Psychology in the near future.

## About the University

Northeastern University London has established itself as a prestigious higher education institution based in the heart of London. As part of the global network of Northeastern University, it offers innovative degree programmes, as well as opportunities for (domestic and international) collaborations, e.g. through its connections to both the College of Science and the College of Professional Studies in Boston. It has recently begun offering research degrees, and expects rapid and sustained expansion.
