The Role

Northeastern University London wishes to appoint an Associate Professor (Teaching & Scholarship) in Psychology. The appointee will provide leadership and professional service within the discipline of Psychology and the institution more generally, and develop and deliver innovative and inclusive teaching across a range of areas and levels.

We wish to appoint a specialist in qualitative methods in Psychology, with expertise in Social Psychology and/or Individual Differences. Expertise in Clinical Psychology may also be an asset. Preference may be given to candidates with active interests in the relationship of Psychology to one or more of the following areas: software and/or technology; employment contexts; diversity and inclusion.

Core duties will include: leadership and professional service in Psychology commensurate with appointment at the rank of Associate Professor (including the possibility of line management responsibilities); and the development and delivery of teaching across a range of areas of Psychology, and at various levels.

We particularly encourage applications from those with an interest in innovative teaching, learning and assessment; those with experience of supporting a wide variety of students; and those belonging to groups underrepresented in UK higher education. We are open to appointing on a reduced fraction/job-share basis subject to our business needs.

Department

Psychology is currently a small, but rapidly expanding discipline at Northeastern University London. With strong interdisciplinary links within the institution, including an established Cognitive Science Research Group drawing in Philosophers and Computer Scientists, the team will offer a new BA in Psychology from academic year 2023-24, in addition to its existing minor, as well as courses for visiting students on mobility programmes, and electives for domestic students with majors in other disciplines. There is also potential for graduate level degrees in Psychology in the near future.

About the University

Northeastern University London has established itself as a prestigious higher education institution based in the heart of London. As part of the global network of Northeastern University, it offers innovative degree programmes, as well as opportunities for (domestic and international) collaborations, e.g. through its connections to both the College of Science and the College of Professional Studies in Boston.
